

# EXPLORE CAREERS WITH Big Interview

Big Interview is a tool to help you practice your job interviewing skills so you feel confident and ready. Explore different career paths and discover what interests you by learning what employers in various industries look for and practicing interview questions tailored to those fields.

## STEP 1: EXPLORE COMMON INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

Reviewing common interview questions can help you identify career paths that match your strengths and interests. If employers are asking about something in an interview, you can assume it's an important part of the job or industry. Think of interview questions as your "cheat sheet!"

From your dashboard, select "Interview Practice Sets." You'll see that there are a number of practice sets you can explore:

### **Explore through Industry-Specific Questions**

Industry practice sets are focused on specific job fields (i.e. healthcare, tech, etc.). These sets can give you an idea about what skills and experiences are valued and prioritized within industries you're interested in.

### **Explore through Competency/Skillset Questions**

Competency sets focus on questions related to specific skills and can help you identify strengths and areas of growth. If you don't yet have the skills needed for a role you're interested in, then you can begin exploring opportunities that will allow you to build those skills.

## STEP 2: PRACTICE!

The AI Feedback Tool allows you to record yourself answering questions and offers instant feedback on your performance. Practice using different question sets to learn where you can most improve.

Not ready to record? Select "View Tips & Answers" under any questions set. Read up on common questions and strategies for responding to them.

Practicing a wide range of interview questions helps you understand what employers typically look for in candidates, regardless of the specific role. This broader understanding can inform your career exploration by highlighting the general professional skills and qualities that are valued in the workplace.

### PRO TIP

While Big Interview primarily focuses on job interviews, the skills you learn while using this tool can also be applied to informational interviews (conversations with professionals who are working in your fields of interest). You can practice asking insightful questions about their role and industry, helping you gather valuable information for career exploration.
